


• Take your time and you will succeed in completing your school assignments.

Ways to start?



Locker & Binder Set up

- There are two ways to set up binders. This depends on the comfort of the student.
 - a 1 inch binder for each subject
 - a 2 inch binder for 2 subjects at a time
 - Students have locker breaks after 2 classes so this sometimes is better for the organization of a student.

tabs in the binder (except Special Area binder):

- notes
- bellwork
- homework
- tests/quizzes

Some subjects may have a bit of word change according to the work in the classroom.

3-ring binders (1-inch size) with

(4) plastic pocket dividers in each:


- S.S./Religion: 2 red binders
- English/Literature: 2 white binders
- Math/Science: 2 green binders
- Special Area: 1 blue binder


<u>OR</u>

2. Classes in the same time block grouped together in a binder


- (3) 3-ring binders (2-inch size) with
- (8) plastic pocket dividers in each:
 - Social Studies/Religion: red binder
 - English/Literature: white binder
 - Math/Science: green binder
- (1) 3-ring binder (1-inch size) with (4) plastic pocket dividers:
 - Special Area: 1 blue binder







Single binder labeling






Double binder labeling and tab set up
